

Amount Requested: \$500,000

Cormorant management protects important aspects of the region's outdoor tourism and quality of life. Invasive cormorants eating walleye and yellow perch in Oneida Lake resulted in a collapse New York's #1 inland fishery from 1987 to 1998. An impact study by the USDA documented the loss of \$540 million in revenue and 12,000 jobs to the 4-county area due to non-resident anglers no longer coming to Oneida Lake to fish. Since 2004 this program has restored: the fishery (partially); threatened species habitat; \$170 million in revenue; and 1,400 to 3,000 jobs.
